Rest in Peace Pope Benedict & Mother Celine

At the end of last year, the Lord called two holy, beloved leaders home — Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI, who guided the Catholic Church as our Holy Father for eight years, and Mother Celine de la Visitation. who guided the Congregation of the Little Sisters of the Poor as Superior General for 19 years.

Mother Celine dedicated her life to serving the needy elderly for 65 years. She also worked tirelessly to advance the cause of Jeanne Jugan's Canonization. She had the joy of being present when Pope Benedict canonized our Mother Foundress. In 2012, we happily welcomed her to our Home. As was her nature, she greeted every Resident and presented each with a gift. We will always remember her infectious smile. She made everyone feel like she was their dear friend – which in spirit, she was.

Pope Benedict presided at the Canonization of Jeanne Jugan in 2009. In his homily, He spoke of the charism of Jeanne Jugan and the Little Sisters of



the Poor, "Her charism is always relevant, while so many aged persons suffer different types of poverty and solitude, sometimes even abandoned by their families. The spirit of hospitality and fraternal love, founded on limitless trust in Providence, ... illuminated her whole existence. The evangelical impulse is followed today throughout the world in the Congregation of the Little Sisters of the Poor, which she founded and which bears witness to her following the mercy of God and the compassionate love of the Heart of Jesus for the littlest ones."



In 2010 during a visit to the UK, Pope Benedict stopped at our Home in London. He spoke from his heart identifying with our Residents as an aged person. He evoked the memory of John Paul II, whom he said "suffered very publicly during the last years of his life." The Pope reaffirmed the dignity of the elderly and our duty to care for them—not as an act of generosity, but as a debt of gratitude.

Two lives well lived. Pope Benedict XVI and Mother Celine, may they rest in peace in the arms of Our Lord. Well done good and faithful servants!

MEET BETTY



Betty moved into our Home 28 years ago. Now 97 years old, she is the longest residing Resident at St. Joseph's Home.

Betty remembers that her childhood was joyfully filled with family, sports, travel and Catholic schools. In 1950, she married a WWII veteran whose leg was amputated from his war wounds. They had two sons. After a tragic accident, her husband passed away suddenly in 1971.

It was a whirlwind raising the boys and keeping her family afloat. Betty initially took her husband's job at the family auto parts business. When she remarried in 1975, the family left Chicago for Arkansas to work on a cattle ranch. Following the job trail, they moved again to Texas, where she worked various jobs. Her biggest challenge was managing a county jail kitchen, serving 120 meals a day. After retiring due to health problems, Betty trained dogs.

Financial and other personal hardships brought Betty back to Chicago in 1991 to live with her youngest son and his new wife. Childhood diabetes had left her daughter-in-law blind. Betty did her best to help them.

In 1995, another daughter-in-law saw in the newspaper that St. Joseph's Home had converted a three-story wing to apartments. Betty applied and was accepted.

Betty tells us that the challenges and struggles which she faced most of her life lifted when she moved here. Over the years, she has made many dear friends. "We look out for each other. The Little Sisters and staff are here to help us. There is always somebody to help, always somebody who cares. The Little Sisters make this such a happy place. I have all I need. It is truly heaven on earth."

Miracle or Coincidence?

Miracles or coincidences? It all depends on how you look at what is going on around us in the world. It is amazing the ways the Lord performs miracles. It's easy to dismiss random happenings as coincidences, but we have just seen too many and know that they are 'God-incidences'. These miracles come at our time in need, confirming to us that God is indeed listening, watching and manifesting His love for us through your generosity.

Recently, one of these 'God-incidences' unfolded in our lobby. Last year when Ryan Loftus was in 8th grade and preparing for his Confirmation, he was asked to perform an act of kindness. His family have been long-time parishioners of St. Thomas of Villanova Parish. Knowing that his former pastor, Fr. Tom Rzepiela is a Resident at our Home, Ryan decided to help us. He collected boxes of facial tissues for us from his hockey teammates, family and friends.

A few weeks ago, during a wake of a St. Thomas Parishioner, Ryan now a freshman at St. Viator High School, saw Fr. Tom and asked how everything was going at our Home. Father jokingly

answered, "Great, but we have one big problem, we're out of facial tissues." Ryan responded, "Well, we need to do something about that!" Determined to help, Ryan rallied his family and friends asking for their assistance.

Three days later Joanne, one of our Residents, had run out of facial tissues and was in search of a new box. After

morning Mass, she was riding down to the first floor with Fr. Tom in the elevator. She was in tears because her facial tissues box was empty and she was unable to find a new box.

Facial tissues may seem like a trivial convenience, but to us it is a cherished commodity! It is a small comfort that we can offer to our Residents. Especially in the winter months, we go through cases and cases of facial tissues.

Joanne was on her way to the lobby to ask the receptionist for help in finding a new box. As the elevator doors opened, Ryan was walking in the front door with 127 boxes of facial tissues that he had collected in just three days. Fr. Tom smiled and said, "Joanne take a seat on the chair in the lobby. I know exactly where I can get you a new box of facial tissues."

We can't help but smile at the expert orchestration of God's timing. The Lord planned this perfectly and it couldn't have come together any better. Sometimes He quickly answers prayers, even in the time that it takes for an elevator to travel between floors.
